Kilchberg, Zürich

Present: Mesdames, Smart and Briner, Messieurs Christou, Hart, Kluger, and Watzlawik.

Purpose: The purpose of this meeting was to form an organization of the graduates of the C.G. Jung Institute, Zürich. The name of the organization was long discussed and it was finally decided to call it the Association of Analytical Psychologists, and international organizations of the graduates of the C.G. Jung Institute. It was decided not to limit the name, as in time we might wish to include graduates of other Jungian training schools in it.

A draft of the Constitution and By-Laws was worked out. (See it for details)

Mary Briner was chosen for the office of the Executive Secretary. It was decided that she should write to Bill Alex and inform of this meeting and ask him if he wished to be one of the charter members of the organization, as he was the only one not present.
